

Our Summer Workshops offer age appropriate activities that are especially designed to foster creativity, promote self-expression and develop a young child's imagination through the arts, dramatic play, squishing, sorting, mixing, swirling, collecting and building.

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Lunch Bunch Price is \$5 per day.

LUNCH BUNCH is offered for children who...

- are signed up for both morning and afternoon classes.
- attend morning classes but cannot be picked up at noon.
- attend afternoon classes but need to be dropped off before 1:00 p.m.

Children are to bring a sack lunch and a drink. A staff member will meet the children and escort them to a classroom where they will eat lunch, play quiet games, listen to a story, and more. Those who are attending an afternoon class will be escorted to that teacher; those who are leaving the museum will be released to the parent upon sign-out.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Is the museum a non-profit organization?

Yes! The Woodlands Children's Museum is a registered 501(c)3 non-profit organization. Donations are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law.

Q: How do you accommodate my child's needs?

In order for us to be able to help your child have an enjoyable experience with us, we ask that you notify us at the time of registration of any allergies, accessibility concerns, behavioral, psychological, emotional conditions or other special needs. The Museum reserves the right to determine the compatibility of your child's needs within the program. The Museum is NOT responsible for administering medication to children. Please consult your pediatrician about altering the child's dosage so that medication can be administered outside of our program.

Q: How are children supervised?

Parents or guardians are required to physically bring their child(ren) into the Museum's atrium. Children are supervised at all times and escorted on bathroom breaks.

The Woodlands Children's Museum reserves the right to determine, at our discretion, that a child can be withdrawn from a workshop or request that he/she be accompanied by an adult if the program deems this to be warranted. There will be no refund in the event of our request that a child be withdrawn for disciplinary reasons.

Q: May parents stay in the classroom?

Our programs promote independent learning and socialization. If you feel that your child is unable to remain in class without you for more than a few minutes, we suggest waiting a year before sending him/her to our workshops. Parents are required to sign out their child(ren) at the end of class.

Q: Who can I contact during the day if I need to leave a message concerning my child?

Q: How should my child dress for the classes?

The best choice is comfortable clothes that may get messy, closed-toe shoes and a sweater, as the classrooms can get cool. Please do not allow your child to wear shoes with rollers.

Discovery Workshops

4 year-olds

Children must be 4 years old by the start of each session.

Especially designed for 4 year-olds, these classes magically enforce creative play for appropriate childhood development in an environment that fosters creativity and promotes self-expression. Children discover and explore new topics presenting hands-on activities to excite and develop a young child's imagination through the arts and dramatic play, while squishing, sorting, mixing, swirling, collecting or building.

Classes meet for three hours, twice a week on Monday/Wednesday OR Tuesday/Thursday. Please check class schedule for dates and times.

Crazy About Critters

Filled with stories, games, crafts and special guest presenters sharing their furry, feathered and scaly animal friends, this class builds self-confidence and fulfills the natural curious nature of children, while discovering some of nature's "crazy critters."

Insects, Dinosaurs and Mammals

Filled with art projects and hands-on activities, young paleontologists become familiar with many different dinosaurs and other strange and exotic prehistoric creatures. Discover various facts about "a bug's life" while building an insect house and exploring how mammals are like you and me.

Knights and Dragons

The medieval times sets a creative and imaginary journey through storybooks and interactive knight songs and fingerplay, while creating artistic dragon and knight art projects and sprinkling in a little math and movement.

LEGO® Frenzy

Little engineers design, build and create with various beginner and advanced LEGO® kits discovering the basic principles of construction, engineering and simple science principles, while building critical thinking skills.

Life's a Beach

Join us, in our beach environment, building sand castles, discovering sea shells and delighting in hands-on sand play experiments.

Mermaids and Pirates

Aargh!!! Focusing on swashbuckling and "mermaizing" imaginative play, children make pirate hats, mermaid projects and imagine lives as mermaids and pirates through songs, fingerplay and maybe, even delight in a visit from a pirate.



Discovery Workshops

4 year-olds

Children must be 4 years old by the start of each session.

Once Upon A Time

Children bring selected fairy tales to life with hands-on immersion, experiencing different art processes to create projects and activities, using creative and imaginative play to explore their characters and life lessons.

Silly Scientists

Hands-on activities invite children to discover and formulate cause and effect relationships with familiar objects. Become a mad mixer and turn some well-known and, some not very well-known, substances together to make slime or bubbly concoctions to gather facts about volcanoes and other related topics.

Storybook Art

Children are presented with opportunities to be aware of a chosen children's book's graphics and illustrations by combining tactile artistic activities that accompany the style of the story's illustrator and the theme of the story. While enjoying the story, children become more aware of the illustrations and the medium used by the artist to illustrate the story.

Superheroes Adventure

Superheroes have captivated the imaginations of children for many years. Young super heroes will decorate their own capes and masks, play familiar games to discover interesting facts about well-known super-heroes and make special "super power" snacks.

To Infinity and Beyond

Become an amateur astronomer, while pretending to travel to the depths of the universe, discovering exciting facts about our solar system and creating space vests and other space creations.

Trolls Time

There's no day like a Trolls' day. Come have a trolling good time creating a Trolls hat and other art creations, making Trolls snacks, playing themed scavenger hunts and bingo games along with story time, hand rhymes and songs. Calling all Trolls!!!

Array Of Clay

Explore and share in the magical versatility of clay by building coil pots, pinch pots, beads and masks. Adding embellishments, such as straw, found objects or small colorful objects creates results to be cherished for many years to come.

ARTistik Adventure

The young artist with a serious love for art will journey through our metropolis of art, exploring various art mediums such as paper maché, building clay creations, painting with assorted mediums or extended drawings, while encouraging young artists to express their own impressions and insights into their artwork. Join us in this festival of mediums focusing on the process of art to explore new art ideas and techniques.

Cardboard, Paper, Scissors

Journey through the art of creating and embellishing various paper projects using scissors, paints and other creative embellishments. Experience the process of making paper from used and discarded paper products. This is a delightful exploration of the endless possibilities of how old and new paper, different cardboards or little and big paper can be used to create other “art” pieces such as origami, paper maché, jewelry and more.

Crazy About Cultures

Using the lure of geography, the mysteries of history and the diversity of various cultures and art processes from around the world, artistic travelers explore hands-on interactive activities to experience an imaginary journey through different countries or continents, while discovering and experiencing various facts about food, clothing, art and language. Children’s best discoveries of global awareness are made when experiences are tactile and meaningful in their everyday life.

Discovering Great Artists

Explore the styles and techniques of some of the world’s greatest artists. Each art process focuses on one style and one artist. A brief biography and portrait of each artist assists children by inspiring them or adding depth to their own art. Artistic projects create opportunities for children to expand the creative experience and to “learn by doing.”

Dragons, Knights and Wizards, Oh My!!!

With a focus on “medieval madness” children explore some of the highlights of the medieval and renaissance era through castle building out of recycled materials, catapult construction, hats for wizards, dragon or knights and other projects and processes emphasizing the allure of medieval, child-friendly fantasy.



Got Science?

Children love science because it catches their attention and engages their curiosity. Our diverse curriculum explores some physical and chemical properties of different elements, compounds and mixtures, as well as venturing into topics like force and motion, constructing and launching small rockets, hands-on “critter” investigations and observations, and more. Different areas of science from natural sciences to social sciences are explored each time the class is offered so that those attending do not get a repeat class, but an introduction to a whole new experience.

LEGO® Frenzy Meets “Righteous” Robotics

Using creative thinking and problem-solving abilities, children design and build models with LEGO® pieces and kits to satisfy a specific purpose while exploring basic construction concepts, simple machines and how gears work. Young engineers progress to WeDo 2.0™, designed for the early elementary learner to introduce boys and girls to the early principles of robotics. Children build LEGO® models featuring working motors and sensors, then program their robot models to write

stories, solve problems or create innovative projects. Curriculum is designed to develop skills in science, simple technology, engineering and mathematics. Righteous!!!



Scientifically ARTrageous

Combining the curiosity of science and the beauty of art, children will embrace an exciting opportunity to discover basic concepts of science through art experiences. Knowing that children love to explore, experiment and discover, the focus is to build on this natural curiosity while combining the beauty of art and the fascination of science. Children will share this journey discovering and exploring the combination of art processes with science hypothesis and outcomes.

Snack Attack

Cook up a menu without touching a stove to make tasty, healthy and decorative snacks each day. Through storytelling, art activities and music and movement, children discover how to make positive choices in the areas that most affect health. Get your body moving and work up an appetite while experiencing interactive ways to create a healthier lifestyle. Bring an appetite and join the fun!

Trash to Towers

Build beyond the imagination, while discovering the basics of construction wizardry such as engineering, construction design, teamwork and building structures to test the strength and practicality of the architect’s designs with new and recycled materials. Young architects can create buildings from milk cartons, water towers from food storage containers or bridges from cereal boxes and used plastic bags to create cities, habitats on another planet or whatever else their imagination presents.



Lights, Camera, Action and Shakespeare

(July 11-15) (Week 6) Experience make-believe and imagination as we peek into the world of Shakespeare in this interactive theatre arts workshop! Students will explore dancing, singing, theatre games, creating props and so much more! Lights, camera, action!!!!




Creative Coders!

7-10 year-olds



This workshop introduces powerful learning tools for beginner coders. Art and technology merge with projects that include animation, games, interactive stories, bright visuals and drag and drop block-based coding, while providing opportunities for physical art projects to support digital concepts.

Discovering fundamental coding concepts using Scratch, a platform developed by MIT Media Lab, children will enjoy thinking creatively, reason systematically and work collaboratively, as they share their creations with each other. This workshop is a great stepping stone towards a path to advanced coding languages.

RobotiKs and Beyond

Creating with technology

Using the LEGO® Mindstorms® Education platform, EV3 introduces young engineers to the basic fundamentals of building and mechanical principles by engaging and motivating them to design, build and program their robots, using motors, sensors, gears, wheels, axles and various technical components, while gaining a better understanding of how technology can work in real-world applications.


Implementing this STEM curriculum, provides a hands-on solution that develops a strong understanding of the EV3 can help develop creativity, critical thinking, collaboration and communication.

Coding is done by dragging and dropping icons into a line to form commands, allowing students to create, build and then mechanically manipulate their “rover” with space-themed missions and solutions.
